Letter from the AECT President

Keeping calm and carrying on seemed to be the name of the game for the 2020-21 Season. All-of-us Express Children's Theatre (AECT) learned a lot from the COVID-19 abbreviated season a year ago and made the decision to forge ahead for the 32nd Season with nearly all of our productions presented virtually instead of on stage in front of live audiences.

The fall show double bill of *Princess and the Pea/Snow White*, the winter show - *The Prince and the Pauper*, and the spring offering - *Charlotte's Web* were all rehearsed and performed online. Once again, I want to thank the dedicated AECT board, loyal membership, energetic youth, valued partnership with the City of East Lansing and our generous supporters for your continued support and hard work to ensure AECT could carry on through it all!





GUILD PROGRAM



AECT's unique Guild program affords youth the opportunity to learn and excel at backstage crafts. Adult Guild supervisors mentor young people through the sequential stages of learning each of the non-acting areas of stagecraft, including Director, Management, Set Construction, Props, Costumes, Makeup, and Tech (sound and lights) Guilds. This year was also the inaugural year for the Puppetry Crew. The new Youth Leadership Initiatives committee created a guild manual and met with participants to make the process of earning guild badges more transparent to youth and parents.

Youth that work and learn on the guild crews experience a sense of accomplishment, increased self-esteem and gain an appreciation for all aspects of theatre while having fun. Seeing what they helped to create on stage is very rewarding and many come to love the backstage work and want to be involved with it again. The real-life skills participants learn through this process have practical applications outside the world of theater also. Carpentry, sewing, project planning and management, teamwork, mentoring, design aesthetics, problem-solving, time management, and financial budgeting are some of the many skills they learn and practice on a guild crew.



ADDITIONAL PROGRAMS

War of the Worlds: Podcast Writing and Recording

January - May 2021

Led by Tristan Tanner and Audrey Tieman

From January through April, youth met weekly in a virtual writing room on Saturday mornings to write their own podcast version of *War of the Worlds*, setting it as a radio call-in show. After writing, revising, and editing, participants were cast as characters and recorded the podcast, with the radio hosts in a recording studio while other cast members called in over Zoom. The recorded podcast is available on Youtube. In May, participants performed a live reading in the Hannah Community Center auditorium, which was attended by an audience of 66 family members.





The Jungle Book Touring Production

June- August 2021

Led by Jen Shaw and Elena Forman

The Jungle Book is AECT's first touring production, performing in July and August in various venues across East Lansing: East Lansing Arts Festival, MSU's Circle Theatre, Valley Court Park, and the East Lansing Library. The production included live music, written and performed by two East Lansing High School students.

The idea for the touring show was developed by AECT's first Youth Leadership Initiatives (YLI) committee, and the script was written by youth board member Elena Forman, who also co-directed the play. Youth participants auditioned for the touring show and rehearsed on Saturdays throughout the summer. The touring nature of the production challenged the youth to quickly change blocking to accommodate different shapes and sizes of stages.

The AECT nonprofit board raises funds through a variety of fundraising activities, including concessions at live performances, grants from private foundations and public entities, and donations and memberships from individuals.

The Greater Lansing community continued to give generously to our can drive, making up the majority of our donations.

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, we were not able to fundraise in our typical ways. We held a virtual board table for two of our virtual productions, selling opening weekend concession kits and inviting online bidding for signed, framed posters. For the summer production, we were able to resume concessions and sell merchandise at the board table.

As it does every year, the nonprofit board of AECT voted on its commitment to the City of East Lansing for the continued operation of the program. The board contributed \$24,500 to the City of East Lansing for the 2020 – 2021 season.

On the expense side, all areas were under budget.
